The Implicit Association Test

Since most of us are unaware that we have biases, a team at Harvard University devised an online questionnaire to help people recognise the associations that many of us have in respect to factors such as skin colour.

This guestionnaire is called the 'Implicit Association Test'.

The test is not without it's critics, but data collection has so far shown that most people have a preference for their own race and that they also have biases against older people.
